Fee Study Purpose

Consultant Team was engaged to create a dependable long-term funding mechanism that will support the UVBGSA's activities to comply with the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act.

Ukiah Valley Basin must demonstrate progress each year toward achieving sustainability and must achieve sustainability within 20 years (by 2043).

Funding Background

Equal annual contributions from the Joint Powers Agreement members:

- County of Mendocino
- Russian River Flood Control & Water Conservation District
- Upper Russian River Water Agency

JPA specifies the GSA may be funded as authorized by SGMA (commencing with Section 10730 of the Water Code)

Fee Study Goals

- 1. Eliminate contributions from member agencies and establish a fair fee structure that generates a sufficient, stable revenue stream based on best available data and developed information.
- 2. Secure a fee structure adopted with maximum buy-in from stakeholders.
- 3. Maintain transparency throughout the project.

Decide Purpose of the New Fee

Regulatory Activity Only

- Report to the Department of Water Resources on mandated items
- Document well and pumping activity
- Conduct studies and run programs
- Fill data gaps (monitoring wells, weather stations etc.)
- Inspections/enforcement of regulations adopted by the GSA
- General program administration expenses

Management Activity

- Land acquisition for projects
- Build projects (recharge basins, surface water delivery pipelines etc.)



Options

- Wellhead Fee
- Parcel Fee
- Acreage Fee
- Point of Connection Fee
- Extraction Fee
- Hybrid combination of options

Consultant will provide up to 3 fee structures based on stakeholder input and data limitations

How is the Fee Best Determined?

- ☐ Available reliable data
- ☐ Input from the Customer Base
- Resource capabilities of the GSA and participating agencies
- ☐ Legal guidance

Considerations of:

- Reasonable relationship between the charge and benefit received
- Disparities in ability to pay
- Language and cultural barriers

Estimated Revenue Requirement

Best estimate of costs for the next 5 years based on staff knowledge and consultant expertise and experience

Administrative Costs

- ☐ General (County charges, Board meetings, Website, Legal services, Insurance, Fee Program costs)
- ☐ GSP-Driven (GSP implementation oversight, contracts/fiscal management, outreach and engagement, grant writing)

GSP Implementation Actions


- ☐ Monitoring & Reporting (DWR reporting, data collection)
